

Creating a Works Cited

In this exercise, you'll be creating a Works Cited page to get hands-on experience with the MLA citation format. You'll be working with examples of both online and printed sources. I'll provide you with sample citations to use for this task. Additional guidance on MLA formatting can be found in your MLA citation handout and at this online resource: <https://owl.purdue.edu/>

For most essays, the MLA header is usually placed on the first page. However, for this particular exercise, you should place the MLA header at the very top of your document, above the title.

A correctly formatted MLA Works Cited page should include these features:

- The title "Works Cited" centered at the top of the page.
- The entire document should be double-spaced.
- Include your last name and page number in the top right corner; eg, Smith 1
- Use a hanging indent for each citation.
- Arrange all entries in alphabetical order by the author's last name.

Below, basic citation formats and examples for various source types are provided for your reference.

Basic Book Format

Lastname, Firstname. Title of Book. Place of Publication: Publisher, Year of Publication.
Medium of Publication.

Example Book Citation

Zimmerman, Robert. Ethics in the School System. New York: Hoffman-Brown, 1986. Print.

Example Book Citation with More Than One Author

Black, Renee, and Alex Green. Effective School Administration. Boston: Scholastics, 2011.
Print.

Basic Periodical Format

Author(s). "Title of Article." Title of Periodical Day Month Year: pages. Medium of
publication.

Example Magazine Article Citation

Bright, Clara. "Principal Changes Policies." Time 31 Jan. 2011: 113-115. Print.

Example Newspaper Article Citation

Smalley, Jim. "School District Meets Goals for Improvement." The Spokesman Review 31 Jan.
2011: A5. Print.

Basic Internet Format

Editor, author, or compiler name (if available). Name of Site. Name of institution/organization affiliated with the site (sponsor or publisher), date of resource creation (if available). Medium of publication. Date of access. URL.

Example Internet Citation
