Overview

Objective

Your map should accurately reflect the island's geography as described in the book, incorporating the 30 details you've listed. It should be both informative and visually engaging, showcasing your understanding of the text and your ability to synthesize information into a coherent visual format.

Instructions

Review Your Details: Begin by reviewing the list of 30 details about the island you've compiled. These details should include specific locations (e.g., the mountain, the beach, the jungle), key landmarks (e.g., the scar, the beast's supposed location, the platform), and any other geographical or notable features mentioned in the book.

Sketch a Draft: Start with a rough sketch of the island, placing the main geographical features according to their descriptions in the book. Consider the relative locations of these features to each other.

Add Details: Once the basic layout is sketched, add the 30 details you've identified. Label each feature clearly and consider using a legend if necessary. Your map should not only show where things are but also hint at their significance within the story.

Finalize Your Map: Using your draft as a guide, create a clean, final version of your map. You may choose to draw by hand on paper or use digital tools. Ensure that your map is neat, legible, and visually appealing. Creative approaches to depicting the island are encouraged, but clarity and accuracy should not be sacrificed for creativity.

Include a Brief Description: Accompany your map with a short paragraph (100-150 words) explaining your design choices and how the included details contribute to an understanding of the novel's setting and themes.

Marking Criteria (Total: 20 Points)

- Accuracy and Detail (8 points): How accurately and thoroughly the map reflects the island's geography and incorporates the 30 details from the book.
- Clarity and Neatness (4 points): The map's overall legibility, including the neatness of drawings, legibility of labels, and the effectiveness of any legend used.
- Creativity and Presentation (4 points): The aesthetic appeal of the map, including creative design choices that enhance the viewer's understanding of the setting.
- Explanation (4 points): The clarity, insight, and thoughtfulness of the
 accompanying paragraph, including how well it explains the significance of the
 chosen details and their contribution to the thematic and narrative elements of
 the book.
